Sustainability Achievements



Sydney Showground implemented a recycling program with its partner Quayclean to sort and recycle aluminium and bottled products onsite. This program is in line with the government implemented Container Deposit Scheme (CDS). All eligible containers are sorted onsite via Quayclean and sent away for processing. This leads to a cleaner precinct and fewer recyclable materials sent to landfill.



ENVIRONMENTALLY SUSTAINABLE PRACTICES

Sydney Showground is connected to the Sydney Olympic Park Water Reclamation and Management Scheme (WRAMS), which recycles water from sewage and stormwater to supply irrigation, ornamental fountain and toilet flushing applications across Sydney Olympic Park and in the suburb of Newington including Sydney Showground.

This recycled water is supplied by Sydney Water at a lower cost than potable water (drinking water). Sydney Showground uses this resource to irrigate its grounds including ENGIE Stadium as well as for the flushing of toilets.


WRAMS saves more than 850 million litres of potable water annually and treats approximately 550 million litres of sewage each year, which would otherwise be discharged to ocean outfalls.



60% of water use onsite is recycled, non potable. This recycled water is used in various applications around the site including the irrigation systems for ENGIE Stadium and surrounding gardens in addition to all flushing toilets.

Sydney Showground completed upgrade project, replacing all high bay 'house' lights in pavilions to LED Dali controlled fittings amounting to >700 fittings with an estimated 50% reduction in power consumption.

Water savers on taps within areas of ENGIE Stadium providing a 3% saving on water consumption.



The Dome and Halls 2-6 are lit by LED high bay lights that utilise approximately 50% of the power consumption of the metal halide lights they replaced. All high bay lights are dimmable from 0 to 100% and can be individually controlled or as groups locally or remotely.

All streetlights across the SS precinct were upgraded to LED as were the SOP precinct lights surrounding the Dome to Hall 6 and can be controlled from various points around the venue.

The Dome to Halls 2-6 have had an upgrade to all air conditioning chillers and associated infrastructure, reducing power consumption by some 30%



Corporate Social Responsibility

The RAS plays a crucial and significant role supporting regional and rural communities in various ways including, but not limited to:

- \$7m+ a year reinvested into agriculture and regional communities. All revenue generated through Sydney Showground (after costs) are reinvested into the various programs.
- Engaging, educating and informing our communities on the value of sustainable agriculture and quality produce through events which support agricultural excellence and innovation.
- Improving the quality of agricultural produce and animal breeds through competitions we facilitate and fund.
- Valuing and maintaining our facilities and assets at Sydney Showground, providing NSW with an agricultural showcase site unparalleled globally.
- Maximising our investments in competitions and programs that support sustainable agricultural development and educate the community about food, fibre and farming.

- The RAS also has a charitable arm of the business, the RAS Foundation (RASF). The RASF builds strong, vibrant rural communities in NSW through investment in education, training and skills development by providing grants and scholarships.
- The RAS has been providing an education program to the teachers and students of NSW for the past 12 years.
 Thanks to the National Landcare Program, the RAS Edu team now delivers to approx. 500 students every month until the end of 2023. Focus is on water management, GHGs, best practice biosecurity and sustainable practices in farming.
- Staff health & wellbeing is supported by an onsite RAS Fitness program.
